

Use of Funds:

The funds raised will be loaned to the City of Hood River, to pre-pay a Power Purchase Agreement with Common Energy, the System Owner. Common Energy will install the solar system, and sell the power it produces to the City of Hood River. The City's savings on electricity will enable it to pay back the loan to OCPC, which in turn will pay back the investors in the project. After ten years, the City will take over ownership of the solar system.
