

Investment Overview

Jackson County Fire District 5 Solar + Battery Project

The Oregon Clean Power Co-op will install a ground-mounted 75 kW solar + battery system at the Jackson County Fire District 5 main station, at 5811 S Pacific Hwy, in Phoenix. This project will reduce the fire district's carbon footprint and electric bills, and will provide emergency power for the fire station. Financing for the project will come from investment by community members, the Energy Trust of Oregon, and a Renewable Energy Development grant from the Oregon Dept. of Energy. There is no tax investor for this project.

Use of Funds

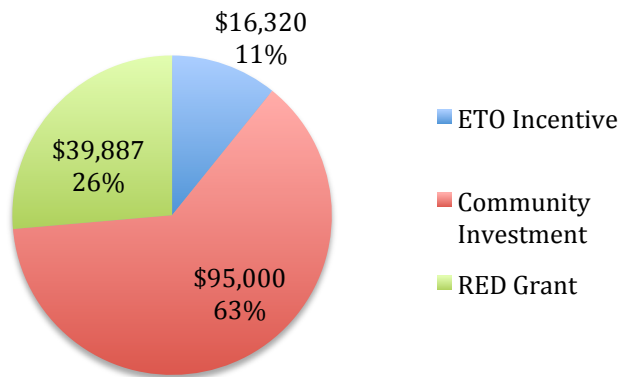
OCPC will use the funds raised to pay for equipment, installation and other project costs. Benton Electric will install the system for OCPC, who will sell the power it produces to the District. The District's savings on electricity will enable it to pay OCPC for the power, and OCPC will use those payments to pay back the investors in the project. After twelve years, the District will take over ownership of the system.
