Energy Independence

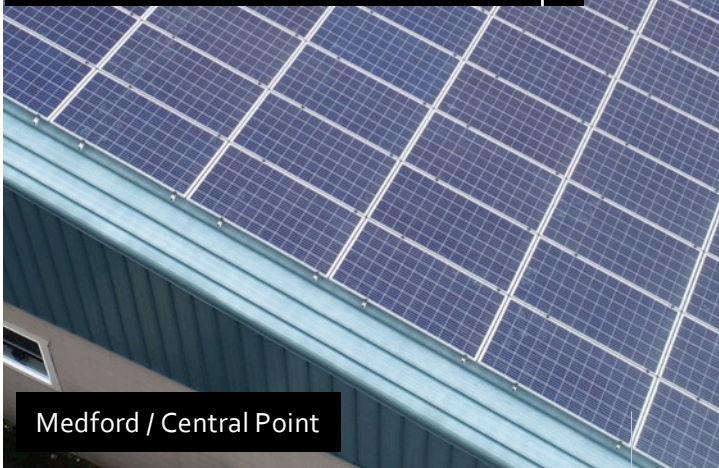

other natural disasters take down the electric grid.

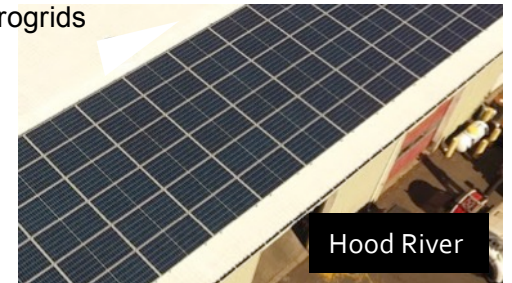
Not Just Solar
