
Investment Overview

OSU Forestry Solar Project

Forestry at Oregon State University will be powered by the sun, with the installation of 828 solar panels (340 kW) on Richardson Hall and Peavy Hall. Richardson Hall, finished in 1999, houses OSU's Department of Wood Science and Engineering and the Department of Forest Science, while adjacent Peavy Hall, built in 2020, is home to OSU's internationally recognized College of Forestry and the Oregon Forest Research Laboratory.

This collaboration between OSU, Oregon Clean Power Co-op and the Corvallis Sustainability Coalition will eliminate an estimated 322 tons of greenhouse gas emissions annually, equivalent to not driving a car more than 746,000 miles a year.

Use of Funds

The funds raised will be used by Oregon Clean Power Co-op to pay for installation of the system, along with incentive funds from Energy Trust of Oregon and a payment from OSU. Oregon Clean Power Co-op expects to pay back community investors after two years, using funds from the federal Investment Tax Credit for the project, made possible by the Inflation Reduction Act.
